In his professional life, he is the Executive Director of the Believe Center, the Executive Director of the Youth Community Connections, and runs his own business Riccardi Consulting, LLC.

Yes, there was a case that I became frustrated with. Eventually, I removed myself from the case as a CASA volunteer and took custody of the youth.
