The CASA volunteer gives the court a second, independent look at the situation, focusing on the best outcome for the child.

A prospective CASA volunteer should be open-minded and compassionate. They should immediately start working on their CASA case!

How did you collaborate and coordinate your investigation efforts with the other professionals on your case? My approach is to keep the Caseworker informed of my activities. I try to have joint visits with the Caseworker and my CASA child.
